**EG**

What is Noun -

A noun is a word that represents a person, place, or thing. Everything we can see or talk about is represented by a word. That word is called a "noun."

Example -

Person - Soldier, Alan, Cousin, lawyer, Men, Doctor, Baby people etc.

Place - Church, School, Home, Coaching, Ocean, Lake, Washington, etc.

Thing - Glass, Sandwich, Deer, Bus Teeth, Tv, Bike, Food, Flowers, etc.

What is Countable Noun -

Countable nouns are nouns which can be counted.

Example -

Dog, Cat, Animal, Man, Person, dollar, table, chair, suitcase

What is Uncountable Noun -

uncountable nouns are substances, concepts etc that we cannot divide into separate elements. We cannot "count" them.

Example -

Music, Art, Love, Happiness, Advice, Information, News
